

SMALL ARMS FIRING SCHOOL & CAMP PERRY FUND MATCH

MAY 14 & 15, 2005

SPONSORED BY: The Wisconsin Rifle & Pistol Association

LOCATION: The Eau Claire National Rifle Club.

The range is located approximately 8 miles east of Eau Claire, WI. From Hwy 53 exit Hwy 124 and North Crossing east (after 1 mile this will be "Q") 5 1/2 miles to "L" south 1 mile to "QQ" east 1 mile to range, Camping is permitted and the gate will be open mid afternoon on Friday May 13 for those that wish to stay overnight.

SCHEDULE : THE NEW SAFS FORMAT STARTED IN 2002 WILL BE CONTINUED. This school will be a 2-day event The 80 Round National Match Course will be spread over both days to allow more time for instruction and practice. All shooters who fire both days will receive an 80 round aggregate for NRA classification and WRPA Team selection purposes. The School and the Camp Perry Fund Match will be fired in conjunction with each other. Please try to attend both days. Sunday May 15th: 7:00 a.m. - 7:45 a.m. Registration.
 8:00 a.m. – Noon 300 Yd Prone Rapid Fire
 Noon - 4:00 p.m. 600 Yd Prone Slow Fire

Each yard line will start out with approximately 20-30 minutes of training with all participants attending. Then we will break down into the squadding.

SLOW FIRE: Block time of 30-40 minutes of practice for the first pair of shooters (coach is in this pair, shooting for coach is optional). Pit change, then another block time of 30 - 40 minutes of practice for the second pair of shooters. Once all practice is done you will fire 2 sighting shots and 20 rounds for record to complete this stage of the National Match Course.

RAPID FIRE: Prep time approximately 5 minutes. Sighting shots unlimited in 5 minutes. Rapid fire strings, up to 3 practice strings will be fired. **NO ALIBIS DURING PRACTICE STRINGS** but training will be giving on how to handle alibis. Once everyone has practiced, you will fire 2 sighting shots and two 10 shot strings in a time limit required by that stage of the National Match Course (60 seconds sitting; 70 seconds prone).

REGISTRATION: Advance Registration is Required. Eau Claire National Rifle Club reserves the Right to accept or refuse any application for this match. Use Attached Application

COURSE FEES: Both Days: Adults \$25.00 Juniors \$14.00
 One Day: Adults \$14.00 Juniors \$ 7.00

CLASSIFICATION: NRA Classification rules will be in effect.

AWARDS: The Purpose of the match is to raise funds to sponsor High Power Rifle Teams at the National Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio. The adult teams will only receive money to cover team fees at Camp Perry. All other funds raised will go to the State Junior Team.

RULES: All current NRA High Power Rifle Rules will apply. All rifles, ammunition, and equipment must conform to the NRA rules. If you need a rulebook, you may order one from the NRA at www.nra.org.

STATE RIFLES: **ALL STATE RIFLES MUST BE TURNED IN AND INVENTORIED AT THIS MATCH.** If you are participating in the Wisconsin High Power program, this firearm can be reissued to you. If you cannot attend this match and/or no longer participating in the state high power program, you must make arrangements to have the state rifle returned to this match.

COACHES: If you are squadded as a coach, you will not be required to pull targets. Coaches may elect to not shoot the practice rounds. If you are classified as High Master or Master and will be available to coach, please make a note of this on your application form. Coaches will be picked by the High Power Director.

SQUADDING: If you are sharing rifles and equipment with other individuals, please note that on the application form. No more than three people can share equipment. Those sharing equipment will be squadded together. Those bringing a new shooter may have the option of being squadded with the new shooter, please note this on the application form. If you are not sharing equipment, please do not say you are just so you can be squadded with your buddy. Every effort for squadding preference will be made for those who register in advance. It is not easy to squad this type of match so please register early.

GENERAL INFO - PLEASE READ

Juniors and adults trying out for the WRPA teams **MUST ATTEND THIS SCHOOL.** Questions regarding attendance requirements should be directed to Bill King, WRPA Competitions Director (bkwrpa@charter.net)

Competitors will be required to score and pull targets. Individuals who do not have Service Rifles but desire to shoot one in this match will be given one to use. Individuals who will be borrowing state rifles in this school should plan on bringing 30-06 ammunition for M1 rifles. Approximately **80 rounds** of ammunition **each day** will be needed to complete this course. (30.06 ball ammo will be available at the range by the Eau Claire club cost will be \$.15 per rd or \$12.00 for each day of shooting).

This course is designed to familiarize Juniors and unclassified individuals with the Service Rifle, High Power Rifle Competition, and National Match Course. This will give first time high power rifle shooters a chance to be trained by expert marksmen prior to competing in their first NRA Approved or Registered Match.

This course is open to all juniors age 14 thru 20, who are interested in learning about shooting the Service Rifle. This course is also open to unclassified adults who are unfamiliar with High Power Rifle competition and shooting, unclassified competitive shooters from another shooting discipline, or Classified High Power Rifle Competitors. If there are insufficient Juniors to fill the range to capacity, priority will be given to Unclassified then Classified adults. Adults classified Expert and above will not be allowed to participate in the clinic if there are Juniors or Unclassified shooters available.

This course is required for all Junior Competitors who will be participating in the WR&PA Junior High Power Training Program, and who are classified as Sharpshooter or Marksman. Juniors who attended this course in 2003, classified Expert or higher, and participating in either of the above listed programs, may be requested to act as coach/instructor for the course if there are insufficient adult coaches available. There will be an experienced adult at each firing point to enforce range and safety rules, and act as coach.

"The school is geared toward the service rifle, but individuals not trying out for state teams may use a NRA match rifle. Service Rifles are classed as the U.S. Models M1, M14, M16 or commercial equivalent such as Springfield Armory M1A, or Colt AR15. Individuals who have their own rifles are encouraged to use them. Rifles will be provided for use during the course for any individual who does not have access to a Service Rifle.

Individuals who have access to shooting coats, mats, gloves and spotting scopes should bring them along. All individuals should bring binoculars for scoring purposes if they do not have access to a spotting scope.

Individuals who will be coming as part of a group may register together. Course fees must accompany the registration. Any registration not accompanied by the course fee will be treated as a Post Registration. Post registrations will be accepted up to the capacity of the range and instructor personnel.

Clubs who will be sending more than one Junior are requested to have at least one responsible adult accompany their Juniors.
