Racine County Line: Located north of Racine, Wisconsin. Take I-94 south of Milwaukee to Seven Mile Road. East on Seven Mile Road. Range is located 1 block east of Highway 32 on Seven Mile Road.

Daniel Boone Range is located northwest of Milwaukee Wisconsin. Take Highway 41 to Highway 167. Range is located 3.5 miles west of Highway 41 on Highway 167.

Hartland Range is located west of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Take Highway I-94 west to Highway SS west to Highway E. South on E two blocks. Range is west off of E.

Competition open to: Public. Must be NRA member.

<u>Entry Fee:</u>	Affiliated club members:	\$10.00 for record match \$ 5.00 for practice matches, can only be fired after record matches.
	Non-affiliated club members:	\$10.00 for record matches + one time \$5.00 fee/year \$ 7.00 for practice matches, can only be fired after record matches.
	Junior shooters:	all fees as above are reduced by \$2.00
	ALL SHOOTERS:	at the first match fired for the season, an additional \$7.00 will be collected for sending in your scores to the NRA for classification.

Entries Close: 15 minutes before firing time.

Firing Starts: Saturday and Sunday morning at 9:00 a.m.
Saturday and Sunday afternoon at 1:00 p.m.

Only Post Entries Accepted: Entries will be accepted on the days listed above, at the range listed above, one hour before entry closing times.

Rules: current NRA High Power Rifle Rules Apply

Flags: All competitors **MUST** have a chamber flag in the chamber when not on the firing line!

Match Course:

National match course: must be fired in this order.

Slow fire stage: 20 shots prone at the MR-52 (600 yards reduced to 200 yards), 10 shots standing at the SR (military) target, with two sighters per position. Total elapsed time of 40 minutes firing time allowed, including sighters.

Rapid Fire Stage: 10 shots sitting at the SR (military) target, time limit 60 seconds: and 10 shots prone at the SR-42 target (300 yards reduced to 200 yards), time limit 70 seconds. Two sighters allowed for each of the rapid fire stages. Any safe, center-fire rifle may be used. The use of palm-rest, butt-hooks, set triggers, etc. is NOT allowed in the National Match Course, either stage. Rules of the current NRA High Power Rifle Rule Book apply (NRA match rifle).

Targets: Targets used will be those listed above.

Classification: Competitors entering the S.W.R.A. competition for the first time will be carried as unclassified until they have fired two matches. They will then be classified on the basis of these two matches. Other competitor's classifications will go up year by year if their average warrants it and they have fired at least three matches per year. To lower their classification, a shooter must fire in a lower classification for two years and fire at least three matches each year.

Entry Limit: Entry is limited to 48 shooters for morning matches and 48 shooters for afternoon matches.

General Information:

AWARDS

Individual Eligibility for Awards: the shooter must compete in at least four of the six matches. The shooter must be an individual S.W.R.A. member or belong to an S.W.R.A. affiliated club.

Eligibility for Team Awards: Teams must compete in at least for four of the six matches. Teams will consist of four shooters.

Junior High Power Awards: Juniors may compete throughout the calendar year in which their 18th birthday occurs as a maximum age. The junior must also compete in at least 4 of the 6 matches and must pull and score targets.

Make up matches: all make-up matches fired will only apply to individual scores and not team scores.

Shoot ahead: Shoot aheads must be stated at sign-up for match. It will be the second match fired. Score cards will be marked accordingly Match no. 2, 3, 4, 5, 6. Forms will be furnished to the match directors. The shooter will complete the form and return it to the match director. It will be sent in with the shooter's score card. A shooter may fire two matches as shoot aheads. If more are needed, the executive officer must be notified.
